CANDIDATES for the Freshman Class, must be able to construe and parse any portion of Virgil, Cicero's Select Oration, and the Greek Testament, and be thoroughly acquainted with Arithmetic as contained in Pike's system, as far as the Roots.

In addition to the above studies, the Senior Class receives Lectures from the Professor of Chemistry, and of Mathematics and Natural Philosophy, on the subjects embraced in their respective departments. In all the Classes, there are stated and frequent exercises in Composition and Declamation; and in the Junior and Senior Classes, in Forensic Disputation also, before their Instructors.

Commencement is on the fourth Wednesday in August.

There are three vacations annually; the first, six weeks from Commencement; the second, three weeks from the second Wednesday in January; the third, four weeks from the second Wednesday in May.

The time appointed for the examination of candidates for admission into College, is the day preceding Commencement. Applicants from a distance, however, may be examined at the close of the ensuing vacation, or at any time when the College is in session.

N. B. The expense of board with the Treasurer's bills, including tuition, room-rent, and contingencies, is about ninety-five dollars annually.
