I went to Lancaster, to Newbury & New. Port - to
Providence - I hope soon to hear of your plans &
expectations - Is Cousin Charles to come down

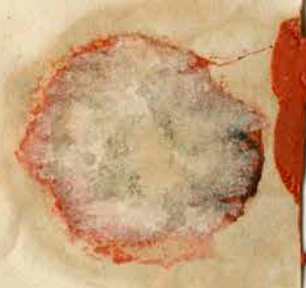
