to all

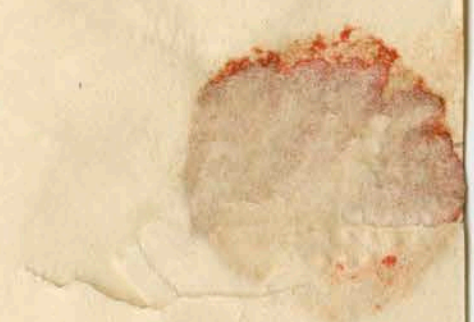
