Do give, grant, bargain, sell and confirm unto the said *Edward*

*one* Pew in the Meeting-House of the First Ecclesiastical Society in New-Haven, the same being N<sup>o</sup> *134*

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the granted premises, to *him* the said *Edward* *his* heirs and assigns forever, to be used as a seat for the purpose of public worship, to *his* and their own proper use and behoof.

And *I* the said *George* do for *my* heirs, executors and administrators, covenant with the said *Edward* *his* heirs, and assigns; that at the ensealing hereof

*I am* well seized of the bargained premises, as an absolute estate and have good right to sell the same as aforesaid, and that the same are free from all incumbrances whatever. And *I* do bind *myself* and *my* heirs by these presents, to WARRANT and defend the bargained premises to *him* the said *Edward* *his* heirs and assigns
